With Matt reverting back to his ugly form and Pete unable to find his long drive down the left side, it was left to Ray and Phil to battle it out on the par 5 14th hole. Phil was on in regulation and a routine two putt clinched his par, but Ray was up to the task as he pitched onto the green and made a saving putt to halve the hole. Ray was the only player able to find the green on 15, and even though he narrowly missed his birdie opportunity, par was enough to win the hole and even the match with three holes to play. The sixteenth was halved with pars as Ray came up just short of the green from the fairway bunker but was able to make par, as was Pete from the fringe, to match Matt's two putt par. Pete won the seventeenth hole with a great par when his approach shot was short of the green and his chip ended up 10 feet from the hole, but a clutch putt completed his four and gave his team the lead with one hole to play. But Matt hit his best drive of the day on 18 and followed with wedge to eight feet, and although he missed his birdie putt, par was sufficient to win the hold and halve the match.

Shot of the Day- After some anxious moments on the previous hole, Matt had a 100 yard approach shot on 12. With a total lack of confidence, he hit a perfect wedge right at the pin that stopped inside of two feet away for a birdie.
