Balls were tossed on the first tee for Sunday's match, scheduled for a full nine holes after Saturday's abbreviated match, pitting Phil and Pete against Ray and Matt. Three players found the tenth fairway and were on the green in regulation, and when nobody could convert the birdie opportunity the hole was halved with pars. None of the players found the newly opened 11<sup>th</sup> green from the tee, but Matt was hole high to the left and chipped to about four feet above the cup, made the downhill putt to win the hole and put his team one up. Ray drove down the middle of the 12<sup>th</sup> fairway and made a routine par, only to be matched by Pete who saved the hole from the base of a tree by pitching toward the green and getting up and down to halve the hole. No pars were made on the thirteenth, but Pete came out of the right side woods near the green by running a low chip into the side of the hill. After another chip, Pete needed a twelve foot putt to tie the hole, which he converted successfully. Uninspired play continued on the par five fourteenth, and Ray and Pete tied the hole with bogevs. The fifteenth hole was halved with pars, as Pete made a long two putt from the left side while Ray converted from the front sand for par. Pete tied the overall match when he was the only player able to par the sixteenth hole. The seventeenth hole was halved with bogeys as Pete came out of the trees to the fairway from his drive, approached the green and two putted, while Matt was short with his drive on the right side and had to take two more shots to land on the green and two putt from there. With the match tied going to the eighteenth hole, Matt and Ray hit tee shots down the middle of the fairway, but Pete's drive caught the cart path on the left side and caromed over the fairway bunker to about 50 yards from the green. He left his chip shot short of the front pin placement and needed another chip, which he almost holed to win the match but settled for par in the end to tie the match.
