Sloppy play continued on the thirteenth when Matt and Ray both bogeved and it was enough to win the hole and square the match. Bogevs again halved a hole, this time the par five fourteenth. Only Pete landed on the green on the short par three, and when neither Ray nor Matt could get up and down for par, Pete's two putts won the hole and put his team back ahead heading up the hill. The ugliness continues on the sixteenth hole, as Ray and Matt both bogeyed but won the hole to even the match. On the seventeenth, Matt was off the green to the right but out of the trap. He hit his chip shot and immediately voiced his displeasure, thinking he had left the shot short, but was surprised when his ball rolled down the slope to about two feet, and his par won the hole and put his team one up going to eighteen. Ray and Matt talked about making par on eighteen to put pressure on Phil and Pete, requiring them to make birdie to tie the match, and that is exactly what they did. But Pete was up to the task, hitting a long drive just short of the left trap and a beautiful wedge to about four or five feet....and calmly sank the putt to win the hole and tie the daily match.
