

## 2009 GRIFFITH HARRIS EARLY-BIRD BACK-NINE CHAMPIONSHIP

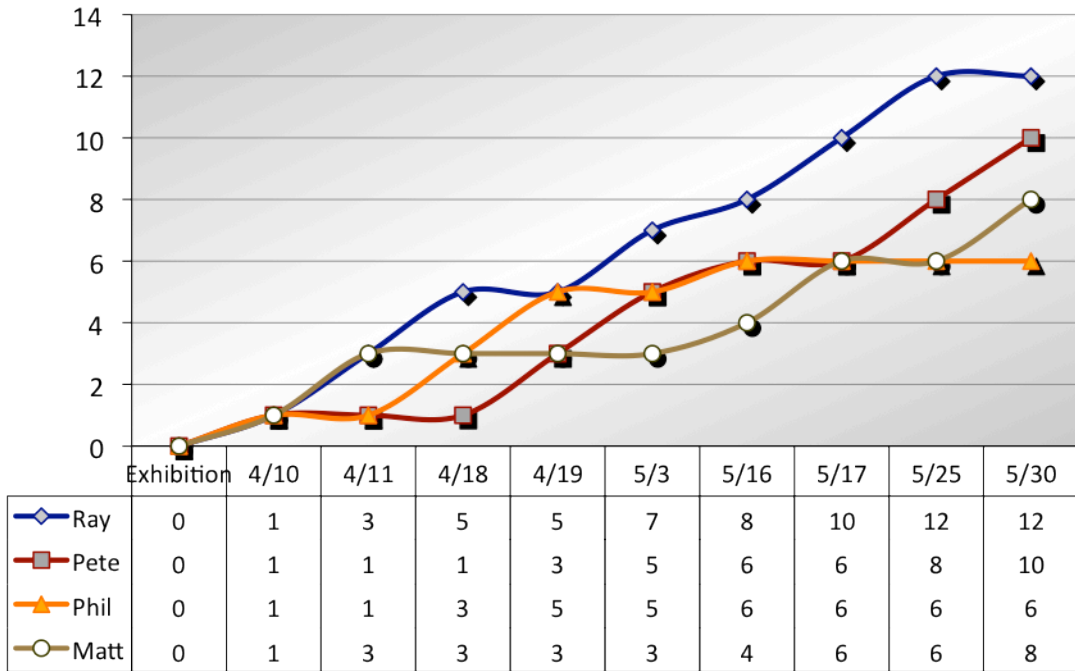

It was a beautiful day after some rain during the week, pairing Ray and Phil ( with his ProV1 #9 ) against Pete and Matt, and having to deal with Jack on the tenth tee as he apparently switched days with Sonny. Only Phil found the fairway on ten, but his team eventually lost the hole. Matt got out of trouble when he punched through the trees on the left and stopped in the rough to the right front of the green, pitched to just one foot away and was conceded his par, while Pete punched his second shot to the fringe and two putted. Ray was on the front of the eleventh green but the pin was way back and he had a very long putt for birdie and had to settle for par with a three foot second putt. Matt was well short of the green and hit the flag stick with his chip, which stopped about eight feet above the hole, but he saved par with a downhill putt to halve the hole. Matt hit his best drive of the day on twelve, sliding into the rough from where he found the green and two putted for par. Meanwhile, Phil had about 145 for his second shot, also found the green and made par....and Ray found the road off the tee and ended up pin high on the thirteenth tee from where he also made par to halve the hole. Everyone was in trouble off the tee on thirteen and nobody could save par, so bogeys halved the hole. Pete saved his par on fourteen after skimming his approach shot long and off the back of the green, from where he chipped back down toward the red flag and made his six foot par putt to win the hole and put his team two up. Pete, Phil and Matt were all on the green on fifteen and each player very narrowly missed birdie and settled for par to keep the match two up. On sixteen, Matt was right next to a tree after a poor tee shot and then hit a beautiful punch shot with a hybrid club to about thirty yards short of the green. From there he chipped to three feet and saved his par, a comeback worthy on any other day of "shot of the day". But his partner outdid him by landing his approach shot just on the front of the green, leaving himself 70+ feet short of the hole....and he made his birdie putt, hitting the back of the hole with authority to win the hole and the match.

**SHOT OF THE DAY-** There are probably a few candidates today, but the winner has to be Pete's 70+ foot putt on sixteen. Not only was it a birdie putt, but it won the hole and closed out the match.
